Each week, we will focus on a different learning skill and work habit with whole school announcements and activities in the classroom to make to ensure that each student knows what the criteria are for each of the skills and can self-assess to determine what they may need to work on to set goals for improvement. This week we will focus on Collaboration. Ask your child(ren) about what they are learning in regards to being effective collaborators.



Supporting Student Achievement:

Many parents are inquiring about supports for their children and how they can help at home. There are a number of resources available from the school board and from the school. All Kindergaren to Grade 3 have a RAZ kids account for leveled texts in English, French, and Spanish to read. Check your child's agenda for the login information.



All Grades 1 and 2 students have a Lexia Account to assist in reading that should be used at least 20 minutes daily. Check your child's agenda for their account information.

All classes have access to Knowledgehook for assistance in mathematics. Many students have won Mathalon awards for their proficiency with this resource. Check with your child's teacher for the login information.

All Kindergarten to Grade 6 French Immersion students have access to French Reading resources: Je lis Je lis. Get account information from your child's teacher.

All students studying French, can access videos, music, and games via Idello. https://apprendre.tfo.org/en.

Check your childs MySite page with their login and password to view all the resources available to them.

Homework Club is offered to those in Grades 7 and 8 on Mondays and Wednesdays for one hour after school. Ask your child's teacher for permission forms.
